# CLIMATE CHANGE EDUCATION

How many of your students understand the systemic nature of the climate crisis, beyond polar bears, plastics and recycling?

The Writing's on the Wall project aims to address the gap between knowledge and action by offering a new way for schools across Europe – and the world – to integrate climate change into their curricula with a fun, fact-focused initiative combining activism, art and journalism.

From September 2022 to July 2023, participating schools can access **thought-provoking workshops** on climate issues, **interactive webinars** with experts, **professional development** for educators and student **training** in journalism and multimedia, including a **storytelling competition**. All project materials will be available on an open access webspace.
