News Decoder is a global educational news service for young people. We partner with schools around the world to teach journalism and media literacy skills that extend students' horizons and understanding of global issues.

Why we do it

Tackling the multiple, interconnected challenges of the 21st century requires savvy, informed and responsible global citizens.

News Decoder approaches this in a unique way: we use journalism training and news literacy to nurture the skills, knowledge and values that students need to cooperate in resolving the great global challenges of our time, including conflict, poverty, sustainability and climate change.

Our services

Students and faculty at our partner schools have access to an array of interactive, hands-on and exclusive educational services:



CONTENT PRODUCTION: Students identify story topics, pitch their ideas, conduct research and reporting and work with News Decoder's editors to produce multimedia content that is published on our global news site. Faculty can task their students with producing content for us as part of a classroom assignment, or students can independently work with the News Decoder team to produce reported stories, personal reflection essays, poetry, podcasts and more.



MENTORING: News Decoder's editorial team works closely with students at our partner schools. We guide them through our signature "Pitch, Report, Draft, Revise" process that helps them develop critical thinking and writing skills; we share our expertise in workshops and webinars; and we offer personalized feedback that challenges students to consider diverse perspectives, check their biases, consult experts and identify solutions to problems.



CO-SCHOOL COLLABORATION: Schools have the opportunity to be paired with a partner school in another region for cross-school collaboration on webinars and multimedia production. Paired teams identify reportable topics relating to a common global theme such as the environment, immigration or social inequality; conduct reporting; present findings to each other during a one-hour webinar; and co-produce multimedia packages that showcase their findings.

Our services, cont.



WORKSHOPS: We host virtual workshops that students from all of our partner schools are invited to join. The interactive workshops are led by News Decoder's correspondents or a member of our editorial team and cover topics such as interviewing, reporting and drafting techniques and media literacy.



E-LEARNING COURSES: Students and faculty have exclusive access to our library of virtual courses developed by journalists.

- **Media Literacy:** Think critically about media's functions; question who owns media and why; identify good-quality media from bad.
- Reporting 101: Learn how to secure, prepare for and conduct interviews; build skills to deepen understanding of complex issues.
- **Drafting 101:** Learn how to craft stories that capture others' attention and convey important information.
- **Podcast Creation:** Learn how to produce a podcast from start to finish, and best practices in podcasting.



EDUCATORS' CATALOG: Each month, faculty receive our Educators' Catalog, a curated selection of the top educational articles we have published that month with accompanying classroom activities. Our articles impartially explain — "decode" — globally significant events, institutions and innovations and are designed to be used as teaching resources. Articles end with questions that can support student exercises like Q&A, research projects or debates.



SOCIAL MEDIA PROMOTION: News Decoder frequently spotlights students and partner schools in our website, newsletter and social media communications. Published students can add their work to portfolios and CVs when applying for internships, jobs or university. Schools can point to the News Decoder partnership and their students' successes as examples of their commitment to global citizenship.

HOW A SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP WORKS

News Decoder's innovative educational resources are tailored to student needs and aligned with internationally-recognized global citizenship and digital literacy competencies. Faculty and students from different departments take advantage of our resources in different ways, from integration into English and World Studies classes to global enrichment blocks to after-school clubs.

We offer annual school partnership packages for individual schools and school networks, as well as stand-alone programming options. Please see our full membership menu below.

Membership Levels

ALL-CAMPUS

At the All-Campus level, News Decoder is embedded directly into educators' yearlong curriculum, with all students on campus granted access to our resources. This highly-customizable membership level includes a pairing with a partner school in another region of the world, a cross-border webinar experience and personalized one-on-one mentoring by News Decoder editors.

CAMP

News Decoder Camps are accelerated skill-building experiences where students will learn how to apply journalism techniques to identify and tell important stories that are happening around them. A kick-off workshop with a News Decoder correspondent will show students what it's like to be a foreign correspondent. Then they will work with ND editors to try their hand at finding and reporting a story in their area for a foreign audience. Content created during the week-long camp can be entered into New Decoder's student storytelling contests. This engagement is particularly well-suited for schools that host summer programming.

CLASSROOM

At the Classroom level, News Decoder programming complements existing classroom instruction with a one-week, accelerated skill-building experience. This membership includes a live kick-off workshop with News Decoder editors and a seasoned correspondent. Students will then work asynchronously with our editors to find and report a story, with the goal of having a first draft by the end of the week. After the week's end, students are encouraged to continue working with News Decoder to see their work through ot publication. Content created can be entered into New Decoder's student storytelling contests.

CLUB

News Decoder Clubs are independent student-led engagements supported by ND learning resources and events. Club members are subscribed to the News Decoder platform and receive access to our publishing resources, E-Learning courses, webinar archive and self-guided "how to produce a global webinar" toolkit. Club members are eligible to submit stories to our twice-yearly storytelling contest and are featured on our website. Requires a club leader or faculty sponsor to facilitate enrollment process.

SCHOOL TRIP WORKSHOPS

As an academic complement to school trips, News Decoder School Trip Workshops prepare students to think like foreign correspondents and synthesize experiences into publishable stories. In pre-departure and post-travel workshops, students learn how to identify a unique story, how to conduct interviews and local research and put it all together in a story that could be published on our global news site. Includes two one-hour workshops with ND editors and support through the story publication process.
