Over the last nine years, News Decoder has reached nearly 19,000 students in almost *50 schools in 23 countries* across five continents.

At its core, our educational philosophy remains unchanged from our founding: we use journalism as both a lens and a tool to help young people make better sense of the world and become more *informed, connected, empowered global citizens*.

Our vision

Imagine a world where every young person participates in shaping a better tomorrow for themselves, their community and the wider world. By teaching and modeling the tools and techniques of journalism, News Decoder empowers young people to take control of their futures and be active and engaged citizens locally, nationally and globally.



News Decoder is a France-based nonprofit that helps young people develop internationally-recognized global citizenship competencies, including the ability to communicate to global audiences, appreciate diverse perspectives, think critically about global issues and identify solutions to problems.



Since 2015, News Decoder has reached thousands of students through partnerships with more than two dozen academic institutions on five continents.

We expanded partnerships through *EU-funded projects*, with a total of 16 consortia partners across Europe.




Empowering Youth Voices



ND Journalism

Our correspondents are passionate about using their knowledge to *open young people's horizons to different ways of seeing and thinking*. Our journalism helps young people deepen their understanding of the world and its interconnectedness, and develop critical thinking and media literacy skills.

Taking advantage of our deep archive of evergreen content, in October 2023 we launched "*Decoder Replay*" to to help readers better understand current world events by seeing how our correspondents decoded similar events in the past.

In 2024, News Decoder received our first grant for journalism from the European Cultural Foundation, for a five-part series called "*Wh-Y Vote?*" covering youth perspectives on the European Parliament elections from five different countries.



CROSS-BORDER EUROPEAN PODCASTING

Launched in September 2023, *WePod* is an innovative twoyear, multi-partner, cross-border project to support the growth and sustainability of the European podcasting ecosystem. As part of this 9-partner, 7-country consortium, *News Decoder leads communications and outreach activities*, including introductory podcast workshops in schools across the EU.

Funded by the Creative Europe Programme of the European Union, Year 1 project highlights include:

- A **3-day project launch** in September 2023 at lead partner PRISA Media headquarters in Madrid, Spain
- Presentations at RadioDays in Munich in March 2024 and the PodcastShow London in May 2024
- **Student podcasting workshop** in May 2024 at the European School Brussels II, with more scheduled for Spain, Germany, Slovenia, France and Italy.

PROMOTING YOUTH CITIZEN JOURNALISM

Mobile Stories is an innovative web-based tool that educates young people in media and information literacy, and improves their skills as media producers. News Decoder leads the development of **English-language educational content** and **user experience** among pilot schools.

Launched in October 2023, in Year 1 the project team has:

- Co-developed Guidelines for AI Usage and Young Reporter's Code of Ethics (link at the end)
- Produced **19 expert journalist tips videos** with 13 journalists from 8 countries
- Created 28 articles and 11 worksheets to supplement the self-guided tool.

To date, the pilot program has reached 281 students in six schools in Finland, Ireland and Romania. Funded by the Creative Europe Programme of the European Union.

ENVIRONMENTAL STORYTELLING

Empowering Youth through Environmental Storytelling — EYES — is a two-year project that kicked off in January 2024, with an in-person consortium meeting in Brussels in February.

Funded by Erasmus+, the project has produced seven self-guided modules of classroom resources, currently being piloted by teachers in classrooms and alternative education spaces around the world. The modules take teachers and students through the *science and politics of climate change* and the *theory and best practices of journalism*, culminating in the production of a climate story as a final assignment.

An expansion of our previous *Writing's on the Wall* grant, with EYES, News Decoder will further develop and refine climate journalism materials and liaise with pilot schools and teachers to help them meet the challenge of teaching climate change education.




